Learning Outcomes: *Students who successfully complete this program will be able to do the following:*

1. Identify and assess the signs and symptoms of illness and injury in patients and conduct triage as needed.
2. Demonstrate an understanding of basic human anatomy and physiology in the application of emergency medical care.
3. Provide medical care and basic life support to patients with respiratory, cardiovascular, neurological, allergic, and OB/GYN emergencies, and with age-related and traumatic injuries.
4. Demonstrate various examination techniques on patients with a medical- or injury-related complaint or problem.
5. Demonstrate the skills required by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians and the State of Arizona Department of Health Services, Bureau of Emergency Medical Services.

Course or program prerequisite(s) not included in the degree:

EMT 174 Emergency Medical Technician requires RDG 122 Reading Critically or exemption.
Students taking EMT 174 for state or national certification must be 18 within six months of course completion.
